

Welcome 2023! Although we continue to struggle with COVID-19, the city has endeavored to find new ways to conduct business and will continue with those new processes as we move forward. We have a great community and I want to thank you for your support of the city and one another during these last few years.

2022 was a busy year for the City and I would like to take this opportunity to share with you the following announcements and updates.

COVID-19 Grant Assistance – As you may recall, Black Diamond was fortunate to receive federal dollars from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA). Among other things it provides for direct federal payments to local government entities to be used in support of efforts to recover from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. This money is currently available for use by the City at least until December 31, 2024. The City Council deter-

mined that it would be in the best interest of the community to distribute \$100,000 of its Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (CLFRF) payments to Black Diamond residents who are financially suffering due to the COVID-19 emergency, through establishment of a new ARPA COVID-19 Economic Hardship Assistance grant program. These economic grants will go to Black Diamond residents to assist with rent and utility payments. The City partnered with the Black Diamond Community Center to distribute these grants. Please con-

Welcome New Councilmember – On November 17, The City Council appointed a new Councilmember due to the resignation of Trish Stallard. Please welcome Brad Douglass to Position No. 2 on the City Council. I look forward to working with him and the other Councilmembers in 2023.

<u>Volunteer Opportunities</u> – Want to make a difference in your community? One way to get involved is to volunteer on various boards and commissions. Below you will find some volunteer opportunities.



Civil Service Commission – This Commission adopts rules and regulations, consistent with State law, for the examination, appointment, demotion, transfer, and promotion of uniformed (Police) personnel. The Commission hears and determines complaints and appeals, with members serving a three-year term. The Commission meets on the first Thursday of the month at 11:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers. If you interested in serving on this Commission and are a US citizen who resides in the city for at least three years immediately preceding such appointment and are an elector in King County and are interested in serving on this important Commission, I encourage you to consider submitting an application. The application form can be found on the City's website at https://www.blackdiamondwa.gov/city-clerk/pages/forms-applications.

Community Gym Ad Hoc Committee - The City Council adopted Resolution No 22-1497 establishing an Ad Hoc Committee to advise the City Council on improvements to the Community Gymnasium. The City has applied for a grant to make substantial improvements to the Gymnasium and if awarded the Council desires to involve local residents in the process of developing a vision and goals for future improvements and to ensure that any funds spend on improvements will align with the current needs and preferences of the community. Members shall be either a resident or work within the City at the time of their appointment and throughout their term on the committee. Committee members shall be nominated by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. It is anticipated that the term of office shall be less than three (3) years. If you are interested in serving on the committee, please submit an application which can be found on the City's website at https://www.blackdiamondwa.gov/city-clerk/pages/forms-applications.

Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Commission – Ordinance No. 22-1179 adopted a new Chapter 20.09 to the City's Municipal Code and established a Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Commission. The Council finds that it would be beneficial to have this commission for the purpose of providing advice and recommendations to the Mayor and City Council on various subject as stated in the ordinance. Members of the Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Commission shall be appointed by the Mayor for a term of three years with the initial appointments serving staggered terms. All members of the commission shall be current residents of, or employees or owners of businesses located in, the City of Black Diamond at the time of appointment and throughout their time on the commission, and shall serve as community stakeholders. In addition, all members of the commission shall have at least a general understanding of the principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion, and obtain, at city expense, a one-day training program from a city-approved training provider within 90 days of appointment. If interested on serving on this commission, I encourage you to submit an application which can be found on the City's website at https://www.blackdiamondwa.gov/city-clerk/pages/forms-applications.





2023 Utility Rate News

Pass-through King County Sewer Rate Increase

King County has increased their monthly pass-through residential sewer rates \$3.44 per month from \$49.27 to \$52.11 a 5.75% increase effective January 1, 2023. This increase will not show on customers bills until they are mailed out at the end of January 2023 for payments due in February 2023. This rate is charged to all King County utility customers to help pay King County for transferring waste from city limits to the King County Transfer Station in Seattle where King County Metro sanitizes waste to protect our waterways before it is released to Puget Sound. At this time, it's not anticipated that City utility rates for water, sewer, and stormwater will increase for 2023.

Black Diamond continues to offer a Lifeline Utility Discount Program of 50% off City billed water, sewer, and stormwater rates (excludes King County sewer charges). This discount is offered to Black Diamond residents that are low-income seniors 62+ age, for low income permanently disabled residents, and low-income VA determined veterans. In addition, a water rate discount is available for residents receiving in-home kidney dialysis. After application and approval, residence will receive a 50% discount from their city billed utilities. STOP THE BLEED®

The Black Diamond Police Department hosted STOP THE BLEED® in conjunction with the Fire Department where 19 community members were taught this important life saving measure. Officer Henrich taught a live—in person class, using training materials specially developed to teach bleeding control techniques. This is important training because A bleeding injury can happen anywhere. We've all seen it happen too often—on the news or in everyday life. Life-threatening bleeding can happen in people injured in serious accidents or disasters. Instead of being a witness, you can become an immediate responder because you know how to STOP THE BLEED®.
