FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

The City of Black Diamond is in the process of updating its Comprehensive Plan. This update is known as the "periodic update" that the City conducts every ten years in accordance with the state Growth Management Act and the revised plan will be finalized by the end of 2024. While this important document is prepared, input from residents and other community members will form a broad and public conversation about the City's future. It is important the City hears from as many interested people as possible; the City invites all interested persons to become involved.

What is a Comprehensive Plan?

The Comprehensive Plan is a document adopted by City Council used to guide development in Black Diamond for the next 20 years. It serves as a guidebook for the city for providing services, facilities, and amenities to accommodate residential and business growth. The updated document will contain a vision describing how the community will look, feel, and function in the year 2044. Goals and policies will provide strategies for achieving the vision. Topics will include housing, land use, parks, economic development, transportation and more.

What are the ways for community members to learn more and become involved?
